

Building Confidence for returning to Campus post Covid

By the time the first wave of Covid-19 had peaked, it was clear that the delivery of skills education through VET colleges was going to have to be done differently than had been the case before the virus emerged. This presented a significant challenge to Directors and Principals as they had to formulate return plans that would incorporate a more flexible paradigm for skills education whilst securing the confidence of staff and students.

Professor Christopher Moore, the recently appointed Principal of New College Lanarkshire in Scotland elected to adopt a Scenario Planning approach to this challenge as this incorporated a process that allowed staff and students to develop a shared response.

Scenario Planning is a tool that helps institutions develop plans for an uncertain future based on what is known and understood about current concerns and the factors that influence them. More prosaically, individuals indulge in scenario planning almost every day and, certainly, when we make long-term plans or reflect upon our ambitions. Consequently, Scenario Planning offered a means through which the principal actors in a large VET school – staff and students – could exercise a degree of control over charting a way forward to the “new normal”.

The process involved consultations with a range of the principal actors across five work streams – Staff, Academic Activity, Professional Services, Student Experience, and Public/External Business. While each work stream focused on a specific domain, each respected the key principles of protecting the safety of staff and students, protecting the quality of the College’s educational offer, and protecting the College’s good reputation.

Each stage of the Scenario Planning consultation process was carried out transparently and included inputs from the relevant trades unions and health and safety experts, and the reporting of outcomes and results were publicised and communicated through the College’s intranet. Not only did this approach ensure the involvement of many people, but it also helped secure their commitment and ownership of the return to work plans and scenarios that were developed.

What is the Network of Networks?

The Network of Networks is an informal alliance of regional and national groupings of colleges providing professional, technical, and vocational education in the skills that the current and future workforce require.

Network of Networks aims to offer an international dimension to the education of our students and the development of our staff.

Partners in the Network of Networks share and exchange experience and cooperate with each other to develop meaningful and sustainable relationships.

Annual face-to-face meetings serve as a practical platform in which views on European and international developments may be shared and translated into practical collaborative projects and initiatives.


